Dear Father Raj,

May the Lord give you peace.

As I write to you in preparation for World Mission Sunday, October 18, 2020, let me begin by thanking you again for your good work in navigating the changes that COVID-19 has brought to our lives. I am personally grateful for the pastoral care you are diligently offering the good people of our diocese and beyond.

Even as you continue your efforts of recovery in our parishes and schools, the world-wide pandemic is challenging the mission of the Church in so many ways. Business and travel shut downs in India are causing hunger, and illnesses are going untreated in rural states. Education in much of Africa has come to a basic standstill crippling forward development. Therefore, in this infamous year of Our Lord, 2020, World Mission Sunday is more vital than ever.

I write to you on the day we lift high the Cross of Jesus Christ. Exalting in this instrument of death as the Tree of Life, we proclaim the victory Our Savior has won over sin and death itself. I encourage you to celebrate **World Mission Sunday**, **2020**, with the extra fervor this year requires. The gifts you inspire will fortify the work of missionaries who serve people in remote and poverty stricken territories whose economies are even more drastically affected than our own.

OFFICE FOR MARRIAGE AND FAMILY LIFE

The Appeal helps support the modest retirement benefits to over 1,700 eligible participants.

OFFICE FOR MINISTRIES AND SOCIAL CONCERNS

This office directs the formation for the permanent diaconate, as well as programs of formation for the laity, including the Lay Formation Institute (over 800 commissioned since 1973) and Leader of Prayer Program (over 300 commissioned since 1989). In addition, this office coordinates pastoral care to the Hispanic community, and it collaborates with the US Bishop programs for national and international relief and development. Catholic Charities, the Diocesan Mission Office, and the diocesan Social Ministry Advisory Committee benefit from the direction of this office.

OFFICE OF SACRED WORSHIP

When attending celebrations at the Cathedral, such as Ordinations, the Chrism Mass, Confirmations, etc. the liturgical guidance from this office is very evident. The staff here also help to deepen our understanding of the Rites and how the manner of the liturgical celebrations impacts our daily lives.
