Lent is upon us. There are a plethora of opportunities being offered at our parishes for communal enrichment. 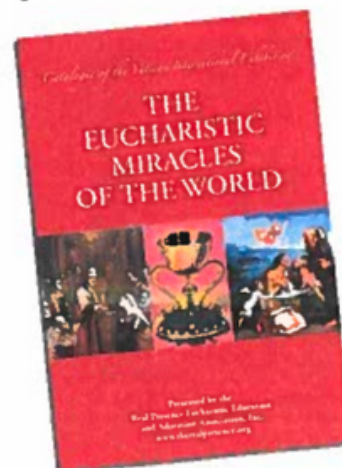
