The 11:15am Sunday Mass at Roncalli Newman will change to 11:00am. Unfortunately there was a miscommunication about when this change is supposed to happen. In order to give parishioners and frequent visitors plenty of notice about the change in Mass time, **it has been decided the change will take effect on Sunday, July 2. On Sunday, July 2, the Sunday Mass at Newman will be at 11:00am. The Saturday and Sunday morning Masses at Blessed Sacrament will remain the same.** This change was made after consulting with numerous parishioners, the parish pastoral and finance councils, consultation with staff, and the majority consensus was 11:00am would be most welcomed.

Finally, on Sunday, June 11, we will celebrate the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ - also known as "Corpus Christi" - with a Eucharistic procession followed by a picnic and outdoor activities for the kids. The procession will take place between the two Sunday morning Masses so both Blessed Sacrament (BSP) and Roncalli Newman Mass attendees can participate. The picnic will follow at BSP and go into the afternoon so parishioners can attend following the 11:15am Mass at Newman. I hope you will put this into your calendar and make this procession a priority, for a Eucharistic procession is something that is special and unique to Catholicism and we should celebrate it.

Roncalli Newman Social Justice Committee Jail Ministry Volunteer Opportunity

Jail Ministry needs volunteers to work with youth. There is an opportunity to provide services/studies for the youth once a week, as needed in the Juvenile Detention Center. We are looking for volunteers that would be interested. They would be placed on a weekly rotation list and would need to call the facility first to see if there is a need that week. If there is, they would provide the service/study. Once we have the volunteers, the specific evening and time will be decided. The facility has on average of 4 youth and they do come from around the state. We are hoping the volunteers would have connections to other churches so when they get out, they could find continued fellowship. The ages are 10 to 17 with most of them being 15 to 16.
