## **Pastoral Notes**

From the desk of Fr. Billy Dodge

Praised be Jesus Christ!

I want to commend everyone for their patience during this time of transition. I know this has been harder on some parishioners than others. We are still early in the process, but I have been impressed by the number of parishioners reaching out to help. Ultimately we have to give this transition time. Whenever there are changes at a parish there are going to be growing pains. For example, when Blessed Sacrament Parish was created in 1938 it was the first non-ethnic parish in the city of La Crosse. Anyone who lived within the boundaries of Blessed Sacrament, whether they be Germans, Irish, Bohemians, and Polish Catholics, had to worship there and no longer at their ethnic parish. There was great consternation because each of these groups had their own cultural traditions. Now no one thinks about nor even remembers those conflicts. Generations have grown up at Blessed Sacrament and only remember the wonderful things they did together. With Blessed Sacrament and Roncalli Newman working together the generations that follow us will not know the struggles we are experiencing. They will simply be grateful for what we build together just as we are grateful for what our predecessors built for us.

### LET YOUR VOICE BE HEARD – JOIN LITURGY COMMITTEE

Liturgy Committee will meet on Tuesday, October 4th @ 5:45 PM in the Gathering Space at Roncalli Newman Parish. If you would like to be part of discussions regarding Ministry Scheduler Pro, Liturgical Ministry scheduling, music selections for Mass, Advent/Christmas traditions at both BSP and RNP, and Mass times/places for Christmas, please email me (Mary Ellen).

As the merger continues to settle, there is a natural shift in leadership. Mary Kerrigan has been part of Environment and Art at RNP for the past 40 years. She has led the group the last 10 years and will step down to spend more time with her family. Mary has an excellent grasp of sacred scripture and worked hard to connect the season's biblical texts with church décor. If you are interested in taking on the role of E & A, please let us know.

### MINISTRY SCHEDULER PRO HAS DONE ITS JOB – THE SCHEDULE IS "LIVE"

We have about 220 active volunteers in the MSP database, and almost 300 total. Ministries that are currently scheduled are Readers, Ministers of Hospitality, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (BSP only), Gift Bearers (RNP only), child and adult servers (BSP only), cantors, accompanists, and Bethany-Riverside volunteers (currently RNP, but could easily involve BSP).

There are a variety of ways to approach scheduling, all of which we are using. For ministries with large rosters (Readers and Ministers of Hospitality), we let the MSP algorithm do the work of sorting out parishioner conflicts and scheduling them at their preferred Mass times. I also have had several requests from parishioners who want to be placed on teams, which means that you are always scheduled with the same people. This presents no problem, and individuals can still pick up sub requests and serve outside of their team.

The only sticky point is that I'm not scheduling teams for a set Sunday of the month. The reason for this is that we have less Masses and twice the number of volunteers, so would be eliminating half of our volunteers if we fixed the same people at the same Sunday each month. Know that there are almost 70 BSP/RNP Readers currently spread over 3 Masses (8-10/month x 3) which ideally allows them each the chance to read once every two months. As numbers settle, we might consider pre-assigning Readers and Ministers of Hospitality every two months, which could be discussed at Liturgy Committee for February-May.

We have a small pool of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, who have been pre-assigned for October-January. "Pre-assignments" allow me to create teams/pairs of communion ministers that are scheduled/pre-assigned for a set Sunday of the month (1st, 2nd, etc.). Even with these pre-assignments, parishioners will still be able to request a sub (which sends an email to all other volunteers in that ministry asking for help).

## **Getting to know Jesus Christ in a deeper way: Reading the Catechism in 15 minutes a day**

We grow in our love for someone as we get to know them better. Would you like to grow in your love for Jesus Christ through coming to know Him better? Reading the Catechism, a few pages each day, will help you deepen your understanding of His incredible love for you. A modest schedule of 15 paragraphs per night (roughly 3 pages) has been arranged that will take about 10-15 minutes of reflective reading, 5 nights a week over 38 weeks. A schedule is emailed to participants every two weeks. To sign up, email Ann Lankford at [alankford@diolc.org](mailto:alankford@diolc.org) with the word Catechism in the subject line. There are usually more than 100 people who participate each year and they express that the fruits are well worth the effort. Invite your friends to join. This process will begin Monday, September 12th.
