Music & Liturgy

From the desk of Mary Ellen Hauptert

Greetings to both BSP and RNP congregations! Father Billy Dodge asked that I lead music and liturgy at both parishes, which has required some orientation to operations at Blessed Sacrament. Thank you to parishioners Jennifer Kulzer, Mary Jo Reinders, Tom Kratt, LuAnne Kratt, Carolyn Steingraeber, Jean Kachel, and Caryl Doberstein for their help and assistance in the first few days of our joint work together. I also want to thank all parishioners for their patience in weathering changes, both now and in the future. The pain of loss at both parishes is palpable and real and needs to be embraced if we're going to make a success of this merger. Keep in mind that whatever hurt you may be feeling in one place is surely felt in the other.

Blessed Sacrament isn't new to me. All four of my children attended the school before ultimately graduating from Aquinas High School. I met Kay Berra as "Miss Sonsalla" and marveled at her ability to remember names. We see each other from time to time on the Viterbo campus and she never fails to inquire about them, by name of course. I also helped Father McGarty with liturgy planning (and even some playing on Saturday nights) before Mary Jo Lium was hired as music director many years ago. I know several BSP families through my children's activities over the years and have been a neighbor to others. It will be nice to reconnect with old friends and meet new people.

My experience in church music began in 1998 when I was hired as the music director at Roncalli Newman Parish by Fr. Mark Pierce. At the time that I was hired, I had a doctorate in piano performance but very little training in scripture and liturgy. The parish was supportive of my education and set aside money so that I could attend the National Pastoral Musicians conference each year and other workshops.

I also completed a certificate in Pastoral Ministries at St. Mary's University in Winona, MN (Tom Skemp was a fellow student) and the four-year Diocesan School of Biblical Studies program. All these experiences helped form my commitment to beautiful liturgies that encourage participation of the faithful.

In addition to planning music and playing for Sunday liturgies, recruiting and training singers and instrumentalists, and leading Liturgy Committee, I have been responsible for coordinating and scheduling ministries at Roncalli Newman Parish. We started using Ministry Scheduler Pro (MSP) four years ago after exploring scheduling software options. I learned about MSP from Bridget Misch, a MMOC parishioner and former Events Coordinator at Viterbo. She said that it was working well at their parish and gave me a very helpful tutorial that was subsequently pitched to RNP's Liturgy Committee. Everyone agreed that it was worth the effort; we even received startup funds from a generous Liturgy Committee member.

There will be a learning curve for BSP volunteers who are using MSP for the first time. I plan have a session at BSP in August for any BSP parishioners who would like a tutorial and hands-on instruction. I am also happy to help parishioners with the program, so if you are comfortable with email, you'll be fine. Beginning this week, we will run a schedule for readers, greeters/ushers, cantors, accompanists, and RNP sacristans. These schedules will be posted on both the BSP and RNP websites.

Father Billy will facilitate a short survey this weekend to gather your ministry interests and updated contact information! I look forward to blending ministries from both parishes and welcome your feedback, comments, questions, and concerns.

Introducing.....Kristin Johnson and our NEW Faith Formation Program

Hello! As your new(ish) Director of Faith Formation I wanted to take some time to introduce myself for those who don't know me and outline the future plans for religious education beginning this Fall. I am a native of La Crosse and grew up attending St. Pius X grade school and Aquinas middle and high school. I attended Viterbo University for my undergraduate degree in Religious Studies and Education and later returned for a Masters Degree in Servant Leadership. I have been married to my husband of sixteen years and mother to two children ages, 8 and 10. For the past sixteen years I have served in ministry at Roncalli Newman. This role has changed and evolved over the years and about six years ago it led to a collaboration among the parishes in the city of La Crosse. The program we were using at Newman for our middle and high school youth (Edge and Life Teen) sparked interest at other parishes and soon developed into a program serving Blessed Sacrament, Cathedral, Holy Trinity, Mary Mother of the Church, and Roncalli Newman. It has been a great joy for me to coordinate this collaboration and see over 100 youth come together each week to grow in their relationship with Jesus.

I have especially loved working with volunteers from all the parishes and meeting other Catholics who love their faith and want to share that love with young people. Among the five city parishes there is a continued desire and necessity to collaborate further. This Fall we will launch a collaborative Family Faith Formation Program among the five city parishes. I have been entrusted with the role of Director for this program. I am excited for this new endeavor and truly feel called to serve in this way. It was our hope to hire someone to step into the role I previously played in coordinating Edge and Life Teen as well as provide additional opportunities for the youth of our parishes. Unfortunately, at this time, we have not been able to achieve this goal. This does mean some changes for our youth programming. Stay tuned for more details on what our program will look like.

Please pray for me and the families in which this new program will serve. I can't wait to see how God will use this change to grow His kingdom.
